## Director's Corner

Where did it go?! Ordinary Time started three weeks into January, and in about 10 days into February, it screeches to a halt with the arrival of Ash Wednesday. Wow, seems like we just experienced Advent preparations for the coming of the Savior and his early-life events, and our Lenten journey commences shortly.

But, God's business screeched our rushed passage to a halt in the midst of Ordinary Time.

"Looking at all the [snowfall] beauty is my Sunday Mass this morning," That was the Facebook posting from my wonderfully Catholic high school classmate Julie Anton here in Northern Virginia, who heeded our bishop's recent dispensation from Mass obligation.

Our late January blizzard was nothing "ordinary" for our 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. Those of us fortunate enough to get to Mass during faced scant assemblies, cantors and choir members.

Those of us otherwise grounded in place felt a range of emotions. Julie's words resonated as we all looked for spiritual "signs" while Mother Nature locked us in our homes or caused our parishes to suspend weekend Masses in which we would be thoroughly engaged. Instead, we all had to "let go, let God" and be forced to truly appreciate how much the sacrifice of the Mass means to us. And, yes, we could join Julie in reflecting on God's presence in a meteorological event of epic proportions.

In last month's Director's Corner, DC Chapter leader Charlene Dorrian so superbly gave us great food for liturgical thought about the role of African-American sacred music in the Church. It got me thinking, even as I routinely apply its tradition and application in my parish.

I grew up in the pre-Vatican Church with our beautiful tapestry of traditional Catholic hymnody and chant, much of it in Latin. It was a sinful act even to step inside a Protestant church, let alone take part in its overflowing bounty of spirituals and gospel music. But during the turbulent '60s in high school and college as Vatican II descended upon us, I got exposed to, and educated in, the sounds of my African-American brethren.

And today, countless times I receive comments about the energy and the richness of African-American sacred music – from spirituals to gospel and even anthem-like



octavos.

So what's preventing pastoral musicians from using the genre in choirs and assemblies? The answer awaits you on Feb. 13 at St. Matthias the Apostle Catholic Church, in Lanham, MD, where my good friend and colleague Lynné Gray presents With Hands Lifted Up: a Journey through African-American Sacred Music.

Over the last 15 years, I've witnessed Lynné in action at parish and national conference levels. I've seen and heard her work with youth and adult choirs, with cantors, with instrumental ensembles. Her mantra is the full, conscious, active, and passionate participation of pastoral musicians and assemblies in the liturgy. You don't want to miss the Feb. 13 workshop! 

#### New Pipe Organ Installed at Saint Matthew Church

Hamner Organ Company, Williamsburg, VA

St. Matthew Catholic Church in Spotsylvania, VA has a new pipe organ!

This parish has 700 families who contributed an extra monthly tithe to purchase this organ as a lasting legacy for future generations.

St. Matthew purchased a vintage Wicks pipe organ built in 1940. (The Wicks Company was one of two major organ builders utilized by the Catholic Churches of that era). Our "rescue organ" has been custom-designed and rebuilt to fit our 40- seat choir loft by the Hamner Organ Company of Williamsburg, VA.

This small pipe organ was originally installed in 1940 at the convent of the Benedictine Sisters of the Sacred Heart in Cullman, AL. Custom-designed for St. Matthew Church, the organ is a 7-rank, 2 manual and pedal pipe organ. It has a manual compass CC to C4 (61 notes) and a pedal compass CCC to G (32 notes).

The original console has a tilting tablet over the top manual, built to AGO specifications. The keyboard is bone naturals with ebony sharps. The organ is totally enclosed.

The organ was dedicated on Nov. 22, 2015 at the parish's Gateway Concert Series where 136 musicians from the area gathered. Small recitals within the larger program were given by Linda C. Long, director of Music Ministries for the church and William Hamner, Jr. builder/voicer, Hamner Organ Company.

How does a small 700-member parish search for a new organ?

NPM offers the perfect resource at our annual conventions. We began the search to replace our Rodgers 1960's 3-manual electronic organ in 2000 at the NPM Convention where organ companies were very generous with their time and expertise.

We compared information disseminated by the digital organ companies with material from experts in the digital world. We eventually concluded that a pipe organ was the best choice for our needs and budget.

Hamner, whose company built the organ at St. Mary Church in Fredericksburg, VA, is knowledgeable and innovative. He and his designer, John Dill of Gainesville, TX specialize in helping smaller churches to obtain exceptional vintage organs.

They listen to pastors and musicians and find a way to bring a Pastor's vision and a musician's needs into reality. We couldn't be happier with our new organ.
